Volunteering

If you are interested in volunteering in the classroom, field trips or the Grade 8 Farewell, please let us know as we would love to have you spend time with our class! Outdoor recesses combined with nature learning experiences, outdoor field trips and regular outdoor PE classes provide a fair amount of fresh air. Ensure that your child comes to school dressed for the changing weather and prepared to be active. VE go outside a LOT (both indoor & outdoo) shoes are needed.

RancheView School is an allergy aware school so we are able to accommodate and support students with severe allergies. Families are asked to not send any food with peanuts, tree nuts and sesame seeds (including hummus), because we have students with life threatening/anaphylactic allergies.

Curriculum in the Classroom

School Work Load

Throughout this year, students will experience a higher level of independent learning while being challenged to think critically and explore various options when completing work. Students are encouraged to think 'outside the box' when working on projects assigned by their teacher.

Assignments, homework and pertinent information can be located in the Moodle courses or Google Classroom ,depending upon the class. All students have access to each platform and are responsible for completing assignments and communicating through these formats.

Students will find extended absences and incomplete assignments create challenges because of an increase in workload. Work that is missed due to absences is still required; if a student needs an extension, arrangements can be made.

Students will find they will require a quiet place at home to work as they could have up towards an hour a day of work at home. If a student is struggling to keep up or is finding schoolwork overwhelming, please talk with us as we have supports to help.

Students are to choose a format to use as an agenda. It is the student's responsibility to use and refer to their agenda on a daily basis to stay on top of their assignments and communicate with their parents about what they are learning. Types of agendas that can be used are: hard cover book or notebook, Google Calendar, Google keep, Desktop notes....

Technology in the Classroom

RTR (real time reporting / PowerSchool)

With RTR, you can check your child's progress at anytime for feedback on assignments, grades, and comments. Feedback will consist of remarks about what they have done well and what needs improvement. Passwords for caregivers, families and students can be found on the PowerSchool letter provided by the office or by contacting the office.

Challenges for Students

Implementing a one-to-one program (computer based learning) in grade 8 can be difficult for some students due to the pull of social media and computer games. Students will be guided through safe online practices when using their devices and as they interact in a 21st Century world. However, students ultimately make their own choices in how they interact with others and how they will use their technology at school.

Google Classroom

Students are to check for regular update of classroom learning, assignments and due dates on a daily basis.

Parents can determine how often they would like to receive updates.

Moodle

Students will be shown in class how to self-enroll and can show you how to access the site. This is a one-time occurrence.

pop's (personal devices)

Some students choose to bring phones or other gaming devices. Although these devices can be used BEFORE or AFTER school, using personally owned devices will not be permitted during class, at recesses, or lunch times unless specified by the teacher. Parents who want to contact their children during the school day can phone the office. Students who wish to contact their parents will be permitted to use the classroom or office phone.

• Students who are not using their devices appropriately will have their device confiscated and/or their privilege of using technology revoked.

Technology Use

In grade 8 we will use technology as our main method of learning. Students will need to bring a device that allows access to work on documents digitally. Chrome books can be loaned from the library once the caregivers and families permission form has been completed and reviewed by the school technician.

• Students who come to school without a device or permission to sign out a "loaner" are expected to complete assignments using a pen and paper.

Please be aware that neither the school nor Rocky View district is responsible for any damages or thefts that may occur to personal technology.
