7. RancheView Fundraising Society Update

Rochelle S provided an update on behalf of RancheView Fundraising Society as follows:

Thank you to those who attended our meeting at the start of this month.

We were able to fund several projects – a \$5,000 fund to off set transportation costs for field trips to be used for all grades, a guitar stand for the music room and some wiring kits to facilitate use of the projectors in each classroom.

We also agreed that the fundraising society would support school council's plans for a family dance by hosting any raffles that are planned.

Before the additional ticket sales at tonight's events, the family bowling raffle had raised approximately \$150.00.

8. Report from the Board of Trustees – Fiona Gilbert

- RVS currently have around 28,000 students however around 800 students are not funded by the government which amounts to almost \$4.5m.
- 22 modular classrooms were requested however only 7 were approved (3 for Fireside, 2 for Cochrane High, and 2 for CCA).
- At present, no modular classrooms are being removed from RancheView however this could change in the future.
- RancheView is now at 84% capacity.
- Bow Valley High were awarded an expansion; the design has still to be approved but the
 plan is for shovels to be in the ground in Spring 2024. The expansion means that the gym
 and music room must be demolished.

- As part of its annual fiscal process, RVS administration brings Infrastructure
 Maintenance and Renewal (IMR) spending for the coming year to the Board for their
 approval.
- In March of 2023, RVS was granted \$2,795,116 in the provincial budget for IMR for the 2023-2024 school year.
 - Highlights of upcoming projects include: Student washroom/change room upgrades for Glenbow School in Cochrane
 - Electrical/fire panel upgrades at schools in Cochrane and Bearspaw
 - Painting and flooring repairs/upgrades throughout the division
 - o Ceiling/LED lighting upgrades at schools in Langdon, Airdrie and Bearspaw
 - o School front door security enhancements for 27 schools
- The result for the 2022/23 year included revenues of \$298.3 million and expenses of \$307.6 million resulting in a deficit of \$9.4 Million. RVS planned to draw \$7.9 million from reserves in 2022/23 but ended up drawing \$9.4 million. The additional draw resulted from increased teacher sick / medical appointment leaves, increased furniture and equipment spending, land acquisition on the Powell Street school site, and 21/22 projects that extended into the 22/23 school year.
- At the end of the 2022/23 year, RVS' operating reserves were at \$3.9 million (1.3% of operating budget). This is at the lower end of government's required operating reserve range (between 1 and 3.2%). Almost all those funds are in our transportation reserve which cannot be used for other needs across the division.
- Nearly all the \$3.8 million of capital reserves were used on the renovation of the school on Powell Street in Cochrane (now Cochrane Christian Academy) and preparing the new high school site in south-west Airdrie.

9. Administration Update

Lynette provided the following admin updates:

- December 1st at 5pm the Emergency Services food drive will be in Sunset.
- Brodie McDonald had a baby boy last week, who has been named Edward.
- The Literacy Committee are hosting a family literacy night in January and are looking for donations for prizes. There will be activities to make reading fun, and this will kickstart the readathon, which is due to start on January 27th and run for 3 weeks.
- A popcorn maker was purchased using funds from Healthy Hunger. Learning Support
 have been using the popcorn maker to promote life skills for complex learners to assist
 with handling currency and food safety.
- Junior B volleyball for girls is on right now; 82% of grade 7 & 8 girls are playing volleyball.
- Junior A basketball try outs are on right now for grade 6, and there is a possibility of a grade 5 basketball club in January.
- The winter musical for Grade 1 & 2 is on December 7th at 6pm; volunteers are required to help set up the cookie table and bake/buy cookies.
- Grades 3 & 4 will have a spring musical, details will follow in the new year.
- Almost 100 students are now involved in the choir and will be performing at the Bearspaw Christmas market on December 8th at 4:30pm.

- The winter concert for choir and band is on December 14th at 6:30pm.
- The kindergarten Christmas concert is on December 21st.
- Lynette gave thanks to the RancheView Fundraising Society and highlighted that the casino night made \$64,000 which can be used to buy items for the school over the next 2 years.
- There are now 28 English additional language learners coming to RancheView.
- The school is being provided with some extra funds from the Learning & Disruption fund from Government.
- The pride crosswalk in front of the school will be repainted in the spring.


Lynette then shared the draft school education plan with attendees and gave an overview of the 4-year plan.
